In a universe inspired, among others, by David Lynch's "Twin Peaks", enter an empty store in the middle of a dark and strange desert. Art meets video game

More than a simple virtual visit, the "Blase Weirdo Emporium" is a video game; halfway between an immersive exhibition and a paper chase.

To progress in the visit and discover new artworks, you will have to search for clues, which will allow you to pass through the doors and discover a preview of the last controversial work of the artist: "The Rise and Fall of the Empire".

Until October 15, players will be able to try to answer a question, the answer to which is in the game. A draw will be made among the correct answers. Who's Blase?

Blase is a French contemporary artist working today in Paris. He became known thanks to his work on old canvases, which he restores and modifies using old master techniques; with brush and oil paint. Always with the desire to mix the classic and the contemporary, the old fashioned and the provocation, and to play with the cognition of his public, Blase has created two series of more confidential paintings: <u>Around the World</u> and <u>Knitted Series</u>. Today, with his sculpture "The Rise and Fall of the empire", Blase marks a turning point in his work and reveals his will to push the limits of his concept and put his creativity at the service of new innovative techniques.
